



SERMON STUDY QUESTIONS FOR MARCH 30, 2014

Sermon Series: Praying for Revival

Sermon: "Seeking God Outside the Camp "

Scripture: Exodus 33:7-11

Preaching: Eric Stiller

1. Have you ever gone through a time in which you experienced spiritual weariness, lifelessness, or increased distance from God because of some entrenched sin? What was that like? What did you do to get out of it?
2. What was the purpose of this tent that Moses set up outside the camp (v. 7b)? What was Moses seeking here? Was he seeking things *from* God, or something else?
3. What is here in this tent that God had said he would withhold from Israel (see v. 9)? Why is this significant? What does it show us about God?
4. Why would the tent, and God's presence in the cloud, be far outside the camp? When our normal "religious" or "spiritual" life has become routine, lifeless, dispassionate, and even sinful, what does this show us about where and how revival can come?
5. As we think about the extraordinary lengths that might sometimes be necessary for spiritual revival, how do we get power for this from Christ? To what lengths did he go? And where did he go to do it (cf. Hebrews 13:12-13)?
