## Sermon Discussion Questions for February 28, 2016

John 7:1-9; "Jesus Is Patient"

Introduction: When is the last time you were impatient with something or someone? What was the result?

Context: Now the feast of Booths was at hand . . . (vs. 2)

- One of three Jewish annual festivals [Unleaved Bread, Weeks, Booths] for which all Jewish males were required to travel to Jerusalem to attend (also called Tabernacles or Ingathering)
- Ex. 23:16; 34:22; Lev. 23:33-36, 39-43; Numb. 29:12-38; Deut. 16:13-15
- Celebration of God's faithfulness and provision in the post-exodus wilderness
- SPIRITUAL LESSON (that needs constant repeating): God is a sovereign and merciful Provider
- APPLICATION QUESTION: What do we as Christians do habitually and faithfully to remind us that God is a sovereign, merciful Provider?
- A. The Expectations of Jesus' brothers (vs. 3-5): For not even his brothers believed in him; show yourself to the world . . .
- B. The Patience of Christ (our text)
  - a. <sup>1</sup>He would not go about in Judea, because the Jews were seeking to kill him
  - b. <sup>6</sup>My time has not yet come
  - c. <sup>8</sup>You go up to the feast. I am not going up to this feast, for my time has not fully come. Question: Where in the Gospels do we ever see Jesus frantic, fearful, or in a rush? Why am I sometimes (or often) frantic, fearful, and in a rush?
- C. Three views of time
  - a. empty secularism: your time is always here (Jesus to his unbelieving brothers, vs. 6)
  - b. frenetic activism: Christians with the attitude: "I've got to make this happen; I have to have it now; why can't others get with the (my) program?"
  - c. tranquil determinism: You go up to the feast. I am not going up to this feast, for my time has not yet fully come (vs. 8)
- D. The call of the Christian to be patient (knowing the law will not make us patient)
  - a. Psalm 37:7
  - b. *Romans* 12:12
  - c. Ephesians 4:2
  - d. Colossians 3:12

- e. I Thessalonians 5:14
- f. II Timothy 4:2
- g. Hebrews 6:12

- E. Attitudinal causes of impatience
  - a. a spirit of entitlement
  - b. a culture of speedy pragmatism/gratification
  - c. a fleshly demandingness
- F. Root causes of impatience
- G. The "root remedy" to these "root causes" > repent and believe the gospel!
