

Sermon Discussion Questions for March 6, 2016

Matthew 9:35-38; "Jesus Is Compassionate"

³⁵And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and affliction. ³⁶When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; ³⁸therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.'

A. Jesus COMBINED (vs. 35)

- 1. Proclamation (teaching, preaching) of the gospel of the kingdom
- 2. Demonstration of the power and presence of the King of that kingdom
- 3. The early 21st century church must likewise "combine" in our culture more so than the early 20th century church did (Clarence McCartney: 1879-1957)
 - a. the "high proclamation/low demonstration" church
 - b. the "low proclamation/high demonstration" church
 - c. the "low proclamation/low demonstration" church
 - d. the "high proclamation/high demonstration" church
- Q. Where would you place Central at this point in our history?
- B. Jesus SAW (vs. 36a)
 - 1. His "incarnation" allowed him to SEE ("you can not see what you cannot see")
 - 2. Application: how are we doing at "seeing" the brokenness of the world around us? The effects of fear/trauma, i.e. "adrenaline dump"
 - a. auditory exclusion
- d. time dilation
- b. loss of memory
- e. TUNNEL VISION (to break this, "scan and
- c. loss of fine motor skills
- assess")
- C. Jesus FELT (vs. 36b: splagxnizomai root spleen = spleen): "inward affection, tender mercy"
 - 1. Our God is a God of compassion! (Ps. 103:13; 135:14; Is. 49:13; 55:7; Micah 7:18)
 - 2. How can we "feel" if we do not "see", and how can we "see" if we do not "go"?
- D. Jesus PERCEIVED (vs. 36c harassed, helpless, sheep without a shepherd)
 - 1. sheep/shepherd metaphor: Numb. 27:17; I Kngs. 22:17; II Chron. 18:16
 - 2. how we perceive the unbelieving world speaks volumes about: our understanding of God, ourselves, and the gospel (Col. 3:12; Heb. 10:34)
- E. Jesus RECRUITED (vs. 37-38)
 - 1. affirmation
 - 2. exhortation
 - 3. celebration Lk. 10:33 (the "good Samaritan") and Lk. 15:20 (the "prodigal son")
