

Sermon Discussion Questions | March 13, 2016 Luke 9:51-62 | "Jesus Is Courageous"

- 1. What is significant about the phrase, he set his face to go to Jerusalem (vs. 51,53)?
- 2. Read *Mark 10:32-34*. Did Jesus know what awaited him in Jerusalem?
- 3. In what does Jesus show his courage in our sermon text today?
- 4. Share an example of an "unwanted destination" in your own life. Why are you hesitant to "go there"? What holds you back?
- 5. Consider *Luke 9:23-25*. If we are to make our life's destination to *follow Jesus*, what will it cost us to do so? What are two or three major barriers or obstacles that you face that make that destination so difficult?
- 6. Read *Hebrews 12:1-2*. Discuss the statement: "My unwanted destination is not my final destination." What difference does having this perspective make?
- 7. Do you agree with the statement: "a primary barrier in radically following Jesus is our fear." Can you give an example from your own life? How are faith and fear often opposites of each other?
- 8. Ponder the following Scriptures that speak about the power of fear: *Gen. 3:10; Prov. 29:25; I Sam. 17:24; Neh. 4:14; Mk. 4:40; Matt. 25:25.*
- 9. Consider how the Lord needed to challenge many godly people in Scripture to not be afraid: *Gen. 46:3; Josh. 11:6; II Kings 1:5; Luke 1:13; 1:30; 5:10; Acts 18:9.* If such godly leaders needed admonished in this way, what does that say about us?
- 10. What does it mean to *put your hand to the plow and not look back (vs. 62)?* What is the definition of "conditional obedience" in today's sermon?
- 11. What is one of the greatest obstacles to "unconditional obedience"?
- 12. Are there any "congregational fears" at Central and, if so, what are they and how do they impact our life and ministry as a church?
- 13. How does the power of the gospel collide with the power of our fears? Which prevails, and why?
- 14. Consider building into your daily life and routine a simple prayer that asks: *Lord, on this day and in every circumstance, may I be led by faith and not by fear for your glory.*
