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Sermon Discussion Questions | May 8, 2016 Mark 7:1-13 and II Thessalonians 2:15-17 | "Looking Unto Jesus, Not to Tradition"

- 1. Share with your group a favorite family tradition that you have practiced, and what benefit it has brought to you and your family. How can traditions be a great blessing to us?
- 2. When Jesus confronts His adversaries in *Mark 7:1-13*, what are the four criticisms that He makes of them (*vs. 7,8,9,13*)?
- 3. In *II Thess. 2:15-17*, why does God command us to *stand firm* and *hold to* apostolic traditions? Is Paul contradicting Jesus is this text?
- 4. In order to evaluate the "rightness" of Christian traditions, three "filters" were presented in this message.

	ORIGIN	MOTIVE	RESULT
Mark 7:1-13	human	selfish	forsaking God
II Thess. 2:15-17	divine	honor God	obeying God

5. In the Protestant Reformation, what was the significance of the term, *sola scriptura*?

Roman Catholic view: Scripture + church tradition = truth

Protestant view: Scripture (alone) = truth (producing godly traditions)

Do you agree with the statement: "Many conservative evangelicals affirm *sola scriptura* but their practice resembles more of a Catholic view of truth."

6. What are the benefits of godly traditions rooted in Scripture and lived out in the cultural context where God has placed His church?



- 7. Discuss the liabilities of traditions that may appear godly but do not honor God.
 - a. legalism: my tradition becomes the means by which I evaluate (judge) others
 - b. stifle the Spirit: my tradition resists the movement and leading of God's Spirit
 - c. false comfort: my tradition brings me emotional comfort rather than relying on Christ for that comfort
 - d. false security: my tradition brings me a sense of security rather than relying on Christ for that security
 - e. self-righteousness: practicing my traditions provides me with a sense that I am pleasing to God
- 8. Why does Pastor Hopper identify the issue of traditions as ultimately a "gospel issue"?
- 9. How does the filter of the gospel bring indictment to man-made, selfish traditions?
- 10. How does the filter of the gospel bring to us a hunger to obey apostolic traditions?
