

Sermon Discussion Questions — May 29, 2016 Psalm 2, Hebrews 1:1-3 | Looking Unto Jesus, Not to Government

- 1. Introduction: Why is important for Christians to acquire a Biblical world view for all things, but especially in regards to politics during this election year?
- 2. Four observations were made from *Psalm 2*. Discuss ways in which you have either seen or experienced any of these four.
 - (a) antagonism toward God (vs. 1-2)
 - (b) rebellion against God (vs. 3)
 - (c) derision from God (vs. 4-5)
 - (d) the decree of God (vs. 6-12)
- 3. Ponder and discuss *Hebrews 1:1-3*. In what ways does this passage teach us something profound about:
 - (a) the person of Christ
 - (b) the work of Christ
 - (c) the sovereignty of Christ
- 4. What is the connection between *Psalm 2* and *Hebrews 1:1-5*?
- 5. There were five general "zip codes" described in this message. Discuss each and identify the one that you tend to "live in" most frequently.
 - (a) idolatrous optimism
 - (b) disengaged pessimism
 - (c) bitter cynicism
 - (d) misguided activism
 - (e) humble & joyful triumphalism
- 6. What is the ground of (e) above? How does the gospel enable us to move and live there?
- 7. What would "repentance" look like for you personally if you have been residing in the wrong zip code?
- 8. Pastor Hopper repeatedly uses a three-fold description of the heart of the gospel. Discuss each individually. What kind of a "gospel" do you have if you remove any of the three? What kind of gospel do you have if you believe and trust all three?
 - (a) the bloody cross
 - (b) the empty tomb
 - (c) the occupied throne
- 9. Take time to praise God for the beauty and comprehensiveness of the gospel's power in your life.
